Anthony Wingham is the President of Métis Nation British Columbia, as well as a Métis entrepreneur, educator and economic development professional. His work has focused on strengthening Indigenous entrepreneurship, expanding economic opportunity, supporting youth and building practical skills within Indigenous communities.

Anthony is the co-founder and Chief Operating Officer of Nuez Acres, an Indigenous-owned, women-led beauty company that has grown from a family business into a nationally distributed brand. He has also worked as an Indigenous Export Advisor with Export Navigator, supporting Indigenous-owned businesses across British Columbia with export readiness, market development and growth.

Through Jelly Academy, Anthony has delivered digital literacy, technology and export-focused training to Indigenous learners and entrepreneurs. His work has also included supporting Indigenous youth through Connected North and the Indigenous Youth Prosperity Foundation.

His broader leadership experience includes serving on the National Aboriginal Capital Corporations Association's Indigenous Youth Business Advisory Council, Vancity's Indigenous Advisory Committee, the BC Indigenous Housing Society and the MNBC Métis Business Advisory Council.
